A Word From the Pastor

Just a little reminder that we have resumed the practice of receiving Holy Communion following the Lamb of God and the response we make: "Lord. I am not worthy ...". Please continue to wear your masks until just prior to receiving Holy Communion and upon receiving, please put your mask back in place for the remainder of the Mass. Likewise, for those who have a preference for receiving Holy Communion on the tongue, please wait until others have received Communion their hands and then come forward to receive Holy Communion.

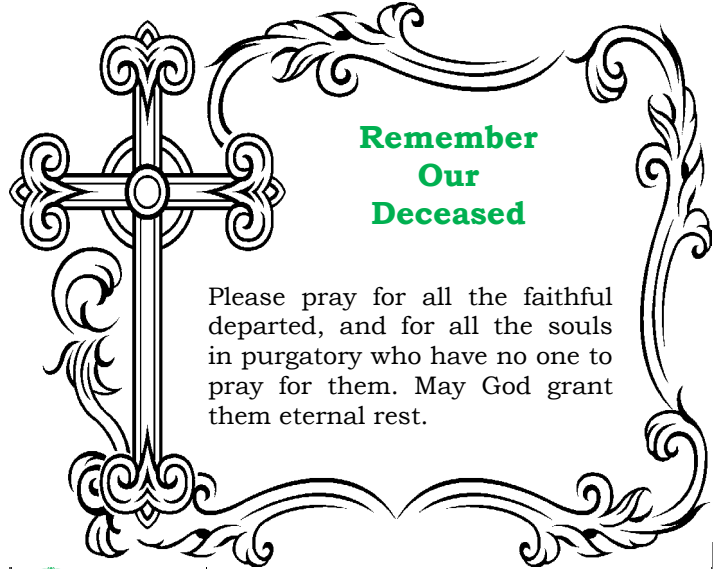

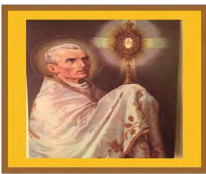

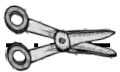
