A Word From the Pastor

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 5: 1-7/Philippians 4: 6-9/Matthew 21:33-43

FOCUS: Our God refuses to give up on us but keeps offering us grace. For the times we have excluded ourselves, taken too much credit for what we have accomplished, or simply have not notice that God is trying to heal us, we ask forgiveness. In the first reading, a prophet challenges the people to bear good fruit by the things they say and do. In the second reading, we learn that the way to peace begins with prayers of gratitude to God. In the Gospel, salvation history is described in terms of an allegory involving a landowner, his vineyard, and his violent, incompetent tenants.

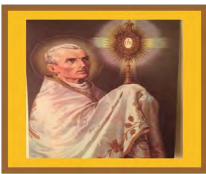
